Papers will be reviewed and selected on the basis of technical quality, relevance and their potential for generating discussion. Papers will be presented either by poster or lecture and in English. Prospective authors are invited to submit titles of papers, keywords and synopses of between 250 to 500 words (**TEXT ONLY** - Please do not submit pictures, figures, graphs, equations etc) to the Events Department either by email or online. The closing date for receipt of synopses is **21 October 2011**. Synopses may be accepted after this date subject to availability in the conference programme (please refer to the IMarEST website for guidance on extensions at www.imarest.org/inec) Please note that all papers are peer reviewed and certain papers may be included in other IMarEST publications after the event.

Authors will be informed of the final programme in **December 2011**. Selected authors will be invited to submit final papers of up to 4000 words, with relevant illustrations by **29 February 2012**.

The IMarEST is delighted to announce the 2012 Sir Donald Gosling Award in association with the 11th International Naval Engineering Conference. The award consists of 3 prizes (first prize £5,000; second prize £2,500; third prize £1,500). Financial awards will be shared equally between named joint authors and a certificate will be awarded for each individual author. All named joint authors must be 35 years of age or under at the time of the conference. In the first instance, authors are asked to submit a synopsis via the call for papers process. You will be asked to provide proof of your date of birth, such as a copy of your passport at the time of synopsis submission. Selected authors will be invited to submit technical papers as outlined; eligible winners must present their paper at the conference, where the award ceremony will take place.
